DARING: to be different. Identifying & embracing who we are. We support the Derby City of Culture 2025 bid with local artists to reflect our culture and heritage


DESIRABLE: a place to work, live, visit and call home. A thriving city centre and a city to be proud of

Linking our cultural & arts heritage with our industrial past and our green future, our city centre will be reimagined using the buildings we already have. A vibrant high street will emerge that gives residents a sense of belonging, participation and pleasure.

We will form a City Centre Improvement Hub to bring together expertise, influence, businesses, organisations, trade unions and city centre residents to unlock our high street and encourage use of empty shops

- Create a Market Place focal point for residents and visitors
- Create a city centre up-cycling industry. From white goods to furniture, from bikes to crafts, art & clothes, we will be a city of recyclers & up-cyclers, making the old, new
- Develop an online, one-stop shop of resources, support and information to encourage and support new businesses, cooperatives and social enterprises to take up space in our City Centre
- Challenge budding artists, graphic designers & students to give Derby its identity through art & design, bringing themes together to unite disparate areas of the city, making Derby recognisable as we enter and travel around our city
- Support the Derby City of Culture 2025 bid and expand our cultural commitment by working with partners for year-round entertainment and celebration of our city
- Embrace community-led housing projects to deliver more housing that suits community needs. We will create a self-build register to support self-build housing across the city
- Deliver a safe, clean, attractive and green city centre

We believe that every child deserves the best start in life, whatever their learning ability. We champion a decent education for all children and work towards improving outcomes in our schools.


We are dedicated to equality of education, pay, gender, ability, race, sexuality, health, mental health and opportunity. We are allies & champions.

We will deliver the Derby Promise for every child

- 1. Opportunity of experiences through school to inspire
- 2. Develop inspiration through work experience opportunities
- 3. Live online vocational lessons with local experts
- 4. 16+ options and opportunities in one place
- 5. Wider apprenticeship options to nurture aspiration
- 6. Next step 18+ guidance to achieve their aspiration
- Introduce School Safety Zones across the city
- Create an Action Group to deal with the Cost of Living crisis
- Campaign for a Real Living Wage for Derby
- Work with expert agencies in the voluntary sector, creating a framework of partnerships to ensure our most vulnerable are supported
- Continue our work towards ending holiday hunger
- Work with partners to improve the council's engagement with all communities, restore Derby Racial Equality Council & work to increase diversity of representation across the council & chamber
- Increase local Special Education Needs (SEND) provision
- Work with partners to provide positive youth programmes across the city
- Work with partners in social care to give paid/ unpaid carers and end users a united voice
- Develop a self-financing Landlords' Charter incorporating minimum housing standards for Derby tenants





DECARBONISATION for DERBY

We pledge to care for your future, putting the environment at the forefront of everything we do

We are devoted to decarbonisation and clean air for Derby The climate emergency will be the first and most important consideration in all council actions.

No decision, project, partnership or infrastructure change will take place without first ensuring our carbon target is still on track. We recognise that we must reduce car use, increase active travel, public transport accessibility and change travel habits. We must expand our footpaths and cycle paths not our roads; prioritising people not petrol.

DECARBONISED

We will campaign to bring buses back into council control to improve services, increase routes and reduce fares

- Set a Council carbon neutral target of 2030 and work crosspartnership to deliver a zero carbon city by 2035
- Increase the number of officers dedicated to carbon reduction to build a credible council climate department
- Launch a Derby recycling and climate centre to deliver training, education and green initiatives
- Initiate a Waste Review, work within legal & financial boundaries to close the Incinerator and invest in education to reduce waste and increase recycling
- Work with residents to develop low traffic neighbourhoods
- Help reduce heating bills and lower emissions in councilowned housing by insulating and retro-fitting heat pumps or thermal storage
- Deliver a Clean Air Plan for the whole city
- Work with the Youth Council to create a Youth Climate Summit to ensure the ideas and passion of young people is heard
- Support more tree and hedge planting, community orchards, wildflowers and the 'greening' our city with urban trees and planting

DEPENDABLE

We will bring back free Bulky Waste Collections and Compactor Days to reduce fly-tipping across Derby and we will keep brown bin collections free

- Raynesway HWRC will be accessible for all Derby residents
- Invest in our PPOs and Neighbourhood Teams to fight antisocial behaviour, fly-tipping, support neighbourhood pride, community inclusion and development
- Increase PPO presence and street cleaning in our city centre to protect shoppers, shop workers and businesses from abuse and criminality
- Women and girls should feel safe on our streets. We support gender abuse being recognised as a hate crime. We will work cross-partner towards education and culture change
- Support pedal and pedestrian power across the city, providing a dedicated Active Travel Hub to connect resources
- Aim to be a connected cycling city by 2030
- Introduce courtesy crossings at non- traffic light junctions to give people right of way before cars
- Work with schools to create and promote active travel plans
- Create 20mph limits in key hotspots to reduce deaths on our roads
- Prioritise our city's most neglected roads for repair
